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D-NAP Eligibility Checklist

Disaster Period: April 11 – May 10, 2026

Eligibility will be based on residency, income, resources, and disaster-related expenses during the disaster period. Applicants must complete a D-NAP application and provide supporting documents. If documents were lost or made unavailable by the disaster, affidavit forms will be available during the application process.

1. Identification: Provide valid photo identification for the Head of Household and household members.

Head of Household

Household Members

- Driver's License
- Passport
- Government Issued ID

- Birth Certificate
- Passport
- Government Issued ID
- Other acceptable proof of identity

2. Proof of Residency: Must have resided or work in the CNMI (Saipan, Tinian, Rota, and Northern Islands) during April 11- 18, 2026.

Provide proof of residency:

- Utility bill
- Phone Bill
- Vehicle Registration
- Rent Receipt
- Insurance Document
- Other proof showing name and CNMI Address

3. Resource Eligibility: Households must meet the cash and bank account limits at the time of application.

Countable Resources:

- Cash
- Checking account
- Saving account
- Other immediate access to funds

4. Income Eligibility: Households must report the current gross monthly income during the disaster period.

- Current gross monthly income provided see below:

- Income loss/reduction due to disaster
- Disaster-related expenses

Households with income over the D-NAP income limit may not qualify. Disaster-related expenses may be deducted when determining eligibility.

5. Disaster-Related Expenses: Disaster-related expenses may be subtracted from income when determining eligibility.

Examples Include:

- Home/property repairs
- Replacement of damaged belongings
- Medical expenses related to disaster
- Funeral expenses related to a disaster
- Temporary housing costs
- Disaster-related transportation expenses
- Other disaster-related expenses, such as fuel for generators or equipment used to clear property
